REPORT ON TNAI CONFERENCE

A seven days' workshop was organized by Trained Nurses Association of India on the Title "Health Informatics for Nurses and Evidence Based Practice" on the theme "Integration of Nursing Informatics into Evidence Based Practices". The workshop was conducted from 5th December to 11th December, 2022 at CMET, AIIMS, New Delhi.

Sessions of each day started with a brief review session on previous day's topics and group discussion. Everyday, refreshment snacks and lunch was provided to all the participants.



DAY 1 (05/12/2022) - Basics of Computer application for nurses.

The session started with the registration and pre-test followed by a brief introduction and interaction of participants.

The Chief Guest for the Inaugural session was Dr. Srinivas, Director, AIIMS, Delhi. Dr. Latha Venkatesan, Principal, College of Nursing, AIIMS, Delhi unfolded the theme of the workshop.

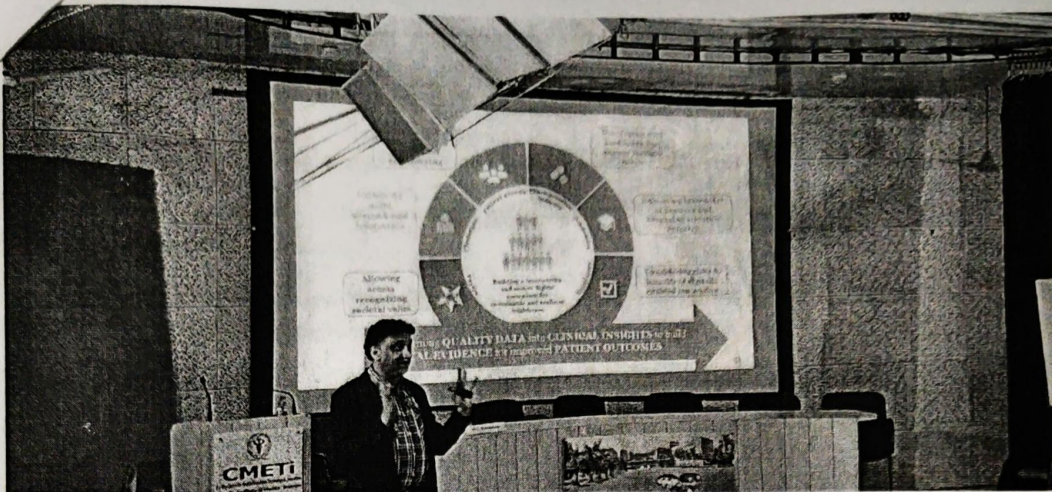
The first session was taken by Dr. Latha Venkatesan who elaborated the importance of computer applications for patient care delivery system and nursing practice.

Ms. Angeleena Singh, Nursing Officer, NIS, gave session on Hospital Information system (HIS)/ Nursing Information System (NIS) - Benefits of Computer automation in Health care. Post lunch, she also showed us the practical aspects of Nursing Informatics used widely in AIIMS, Delhi.

There was another enriching session on E-Health: Use of Information & Communication technology to improve personal and public health care by Dr. Harshal Salve, Additional Professor, Department of CCM, AIIMS, New Delhi.

DAY 3 (07/12/2022) - Electronic Health Records & Documentation

The session was initiated by Dr. L Gopichandran on Health care Apps- Role in Remote monitoring. He also explained about an App: Dhadkan- 2, which he had developed for cardiac patients staying in remote areas, following the treatment from AIIMS. The app had features which would enumerate the onset of early warning signs and compliance to medication regime.

The next session was on EHR- Data Security and Storage by Dr. Narinder Kumar, Senior Resident, Department of Hospital Administration, AIIMS, New Delhi.

A very lively and vibrant session was taken by Mrs. Deepa Chugh, Head of Nursing Services, National Heart Institute, New Delhi on the methods to overcome challenges in implementation of Electronic Health Records.

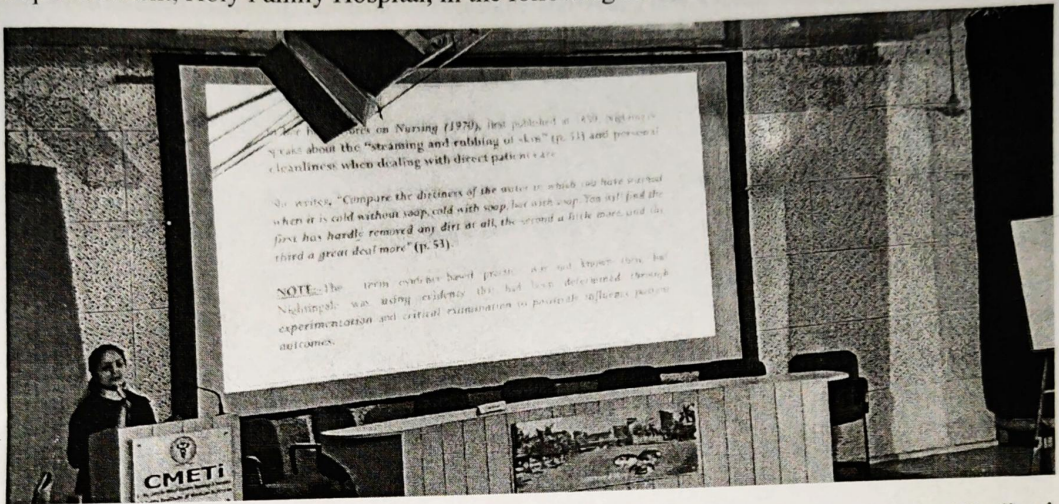

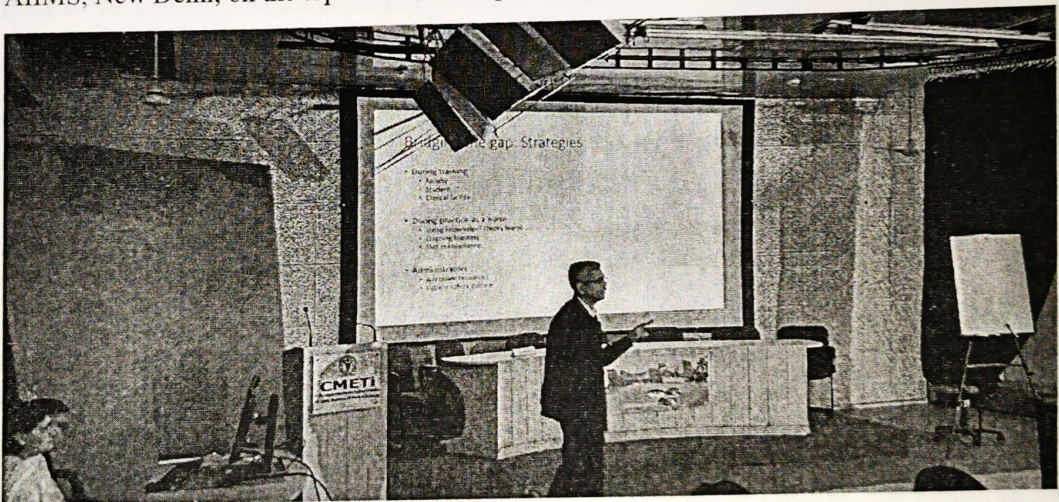
DAY 4 (08/12/2022) - Evidence Based Practice in Nursing

REPORT OF WORKSHOP ON

'PREPARING NURSING INSTITUTIONS FOR NAAC ACCREDITATION'

A workshop was organised by CNE Department of Ahilya Bai college of nursing, under the scheme 'Development of Nursing Services' by Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India from 24/02/2023 to 02/03/2023. Eminent speakers from various prestigious institutes lead the sessions as resource persons. Two senior faculty from different nursing colleges have attended the workshop enthusiastically.

Workshop started with registration and pre-test of delegates followed by Inaugural ceremony.

Day-1(24/02/2023)

Introductory session of the workshop was delivered by Dr. Suresh Kumar Medical Director, LNH on 'Introduction to NAAC, Vision, Mission and core values.'

Ms. Ellen Beck Vice-Principal, ABCON, LNH presented an 'Overview of assessment of institutions for accreditation'.

Post Lunch sessions were dealt by Dr. Sudip Ranjan Jha, Professor, School of Science, IGNOU. Sir detailed the two important aspects of NAAC as 'Implementation of Total Quality Management in Higher Education Institutions' & 'Academic Flexibility with reference to NEP2020 -CBCS & ABC'.

After the tea break, Ms. Ellen Beck Vice-Principal, ABCON, LNH explained about Quality Assurance through NAAC followed by Quality Indicator Framework by Dr. Shobha Gusain Sister Tutor, ABCON, LNH.

Post lunch sessions were on 'the impact of Teaching-Learning Process in Accreditation' and 'Catering to Student Diversity-Special program for slow learners' by Ms. Ellen Beck Vice-Principal, ABCON, LNH.

Day-3(26/02/2023)

Dr. Reeta Devi, Assistant Professor SOHS, IGNOU started the sessions of the third day. The topics were 'Campus Maintenance and Environmental Sustainability' and 'Inclusiveness of Social Groups to Campus Activities'. 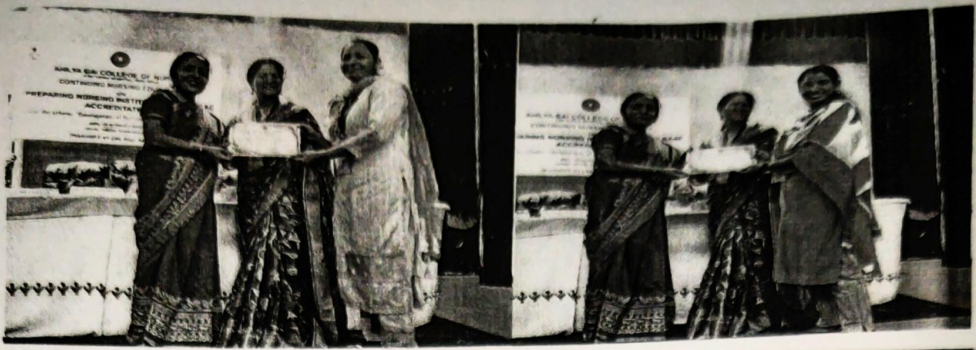
After the lunch, post-test was administered to delegates to assess the effectiveness of each session of the workshop.




Each session of the workshop was enriching and able to sensitise the delegates to implement the activities vital to NAAC accreditation in their own institute.



STATION 4 – Suicidal risk assessment & nursing responsibilities

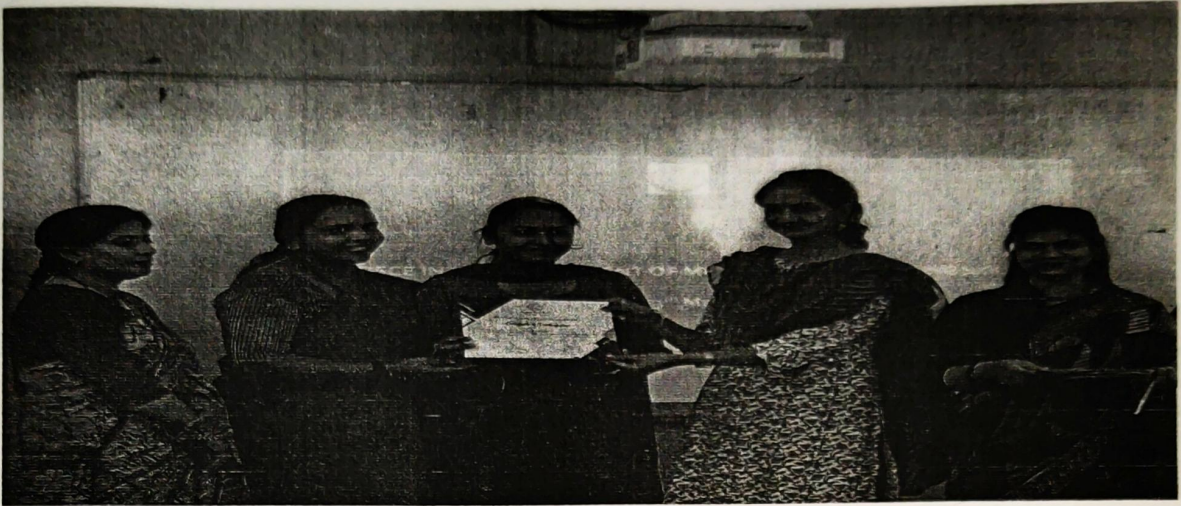
STATION 5 – Rest station



REPORT OF SHORT COURSE ON "HOSPITAL INFECTION PREVENTION, CONTROL AND MANAGEMENT"- AIIMS, NEW DELHI

A workshop was organized by college of nursing, AIIMS, New Delhi under Development of Nursing Services Scheme of Ministry of Health and Family Welfare (MoHFW), Govt. of India from 20th to 27th march 2023 at C.M.E.T wings, AIIMS, New Delhi.

Sessions were taken upon microbial classification and structure, standard safety precautions and infection control practices in different units- ICU, Ward and OPD followed by skill stations using simulation scenarios with reference to hand hygiene, respiratory etiquettes and proper donning and doffing of personal equipment and also discussed case scenarios for using different kind of personal protective equipment as per the given situations.

Day 3.

The training session was taken upon audit in surveillance, sharp injury protocol and safe injection practices.

Post lunch session included skill stations with demonstrations of safe injection practices and sharp disposal.

Day 4.

Eminent speakers took session regarding understanding the immune system, the nature and the pathogenesis of infection, collection and transportation of specimen and sepsis.

A visit to sewage treatment plant followed by case discussion on sepsis and pathogenesis of infection was also organized in afternoon session.

Day 5.

Sessions were upon cleaning, disinfection and sterilization, segregation and handling of laundry, special considerations in handling equipment which followed by hands on training of cleaning, disinfection and sterilization methods to be followed for various equipment and preparation of disinfectants.

educational sessions were taken upon prevention and management of catheter associated urinary tract infection, surgical site infection, central line associated blood stream infection chemical safety measures proceeded by the hands on sessions for the aforementioned HAI' s .

Day 7.

The topics for the final day course included biomedical waste management, hazardous material and spill management and hospital infection control committee's responsibilities and functions. Post-test was done in which all the delegates scored above 75%. Finally, the valedictory session was hosted by Ms. Cecilia Mary. S and the chief guest for the event was Dr. Deepika C Khaka, Nursing Advisor Govt. of India.



REPORT ON ONE DAY WORKSHOP ON PROMOTING RESPECTFUL MATERNITY CARE IN THE PRIVATE SECTOR

On the 19th of April 2023, a One-day Workshop on **Promoting Respectful Maternity Care in the Private Sector** was organized by **The Trained Nurses Association Of India** in collaboration with **White Ribbon Alliance India (WRAI)**. Three faculties of our college attended the workshop enthusiastically. It started with registration process followed by pretest and introductory session. A total of **50 delegates** from different hospitals and college of nursing had participated.

Respectful Maternity Care (RMC) is a universal human right that is due to every childbearing women in every health system could be for maternal health, family planning or any other related services.

OBJECTIVES OF THE COURSE

1. It promotes Respectful Maternity Care among healthcare providers.
2. To promote a relationship of Trust & Respect between the women and the healthcare providers.
3. To add value to the professionals skills of healthcare providers.
4. To raise awareness / sensitize health care providers on common disrespectful and abusive practices and attitudes during maternity care services.
5. Empower health care providers with the knowledge and skills to identify and address disrespect and abuse.
6. To ensure that all women realize their right to be safe and healthy before, during and after childbirth.
7. RMC amplifying women's voice to support improvement in service delivery.

Let institutionalize respectful Maternity Care.

On the inaugural function, Mrs. Evelyn P. Kannan, Secretary General, TNAI, presented the overview of workshop. In this, she emphasized on importance of respectful maternity care, 12 universal rights of women and newborns. She also spoke about the TNAI, a brief history of TNAI, how it has started and steps to follow to become member, its benefits and how this organization works. She advised to come forward to become a member of TNAI.

Dr. Aprarjita Gogoi, Executive Director, C3 participated as a Chief Guest. In address, vision of WRAI people leading change, envision a world where all girls and women realize their right to quality health and well- being. It draws attention towards safe motherhood. White Ribbon is dedicated to the memory of women who have died in pregnancy and childbirth.

THE WORKSHOP WAS DIVIDED INTO 7 SESSIONS

The First session was conducted by Ms. Tina Ravi, Senior Specialist- C. She laid down the objectives, introductions, expectations, and training norms. Goal is to ensure that all women realize their right to be safe and healthy before, during and after childbirth. Principles are shared goals, collective identity, partnership, volunteerism and open membership and collaboration.

The second and third session was conducted by Dr. Nomita Chandhiok, Master Trainer, WRAI, who explained key concepts of Respectful Maternity Care. Care in pregnancy and childbirth characterized by a caring attitude, empathy, support, trust, confidence and empowerment. Policy recommendations for inclusion of RMC- global and Indian, categories of disrespect and abuse, WHO's intrapartum care model for positive child experience – essential physical resource & competent and motivates staffs.

It includes respect for women's autonomy, dignity, feelings, privacy, choices, freedom from ill treatment and coercion and consideration for personal preferences including option for companionship during the maternity care.

RMC is an attitude that permeates each word, action, thought, and non-verbal communication involved in the care of women during pregnancy, childbirth and immediate postpartum period including newborn care.

RMC in LAQSHYA (Government of India Initiative) as a Goal "Reduce preventable maternal and newborn mortality, morbidity and still births associated with the care around delivery in Labour room and Maternity OT and ensure RMC. RMC in Surakshit Matritva Aashwasan (SUMAN).

There were 7 abuse physical abuse, Non-Consented care, Non- Confidential Care, Non-dignified care, Discrimination, Denial of Care, Detention (including informal payments).

Tackling Disrespect and abuse: 12 Rights of Women and Newborns

1. Everyone has the right to freedom from harm and ill-treatment
2. Everyone has the right to information, informed consent, and respect for their choices and preferences, including companion of choice during maternity care and refusal of medical procedures.
3. Everyone has the right to privacy and confidentiality.
4. Everyone is their own person from the moment of birth and has the right to be treated with dignity and respect.
5. Everyone has the right to equality, freedom from discrimination and equitable care.
6. Everyone has the right to healthcare and to the highest attainable level of health.
7. Everyone has the right to liberty, autonomy, self-determination, and freedom from arbitrary detention.
8. Every child has the right to be with their parents or guardians.
9. Every child has the right to an identity and nationality from birth.
10. Everyone has the right to adequate nutrition and clean water.
11. Everyone has the right to a companion of their choice and preference during maternity care.
12. Every woman and newborn have the right to timely and grievance redressal.

The fourth session on Care and respect for the Care givers was conducted by Mrs. Evelyn P. Kannan, Secretary General, TNAI . She spoke about the work-related stress as a driver of D&A during facility- based childbirth, impact of difficult or traumatic work experience on providers , Potential critical incidents and interventions that can lower work-related stress and reduce D&A.

The rest 3 session held after lunch.

The Fifth session was again conducted by Mrs. Evelyn P. Kannan, here she explained about promoting client provider accountability, responsibilities of health service providers / client and their families. Importance of client feedback and grievance redressal mechanism.

The Sixth session was again conducted by Dr. Nomita Chandhiok, Master Trainer, WRAI, she started session by showing a short video on 12rights of respectful maternity care. She explained implementation facility based respectful maternity care. It was a captivating session as it includes case study and evidence-based strategies to reduce disrespect and abuse and approaches to implementing RMC in ANC, childbirth & PNC, allowing and empowering Birth companion with women and Position of choice during labour benefits . Adhering to performance standards for RMC over time will ensure provision of quality MNH services for women at the facility.


Last session was about institutionalizing RMC in the facility. It was conducted by a TNAI team, they performed a role play to understand the networking and implementation of respectful maternity care.

This workshop was a good learning experience for the participants. We had the opportunity to interact with some best resource person in the country. Feedback and vote of thanks addressing given along with Post Test done.







Effectiveness of Nurse Navigation Programme for Patients Undergoing Open Abdominal Surgery in Tertiary Care Hospitals of Delhi with a View to Develop a Nursing Care Protocol

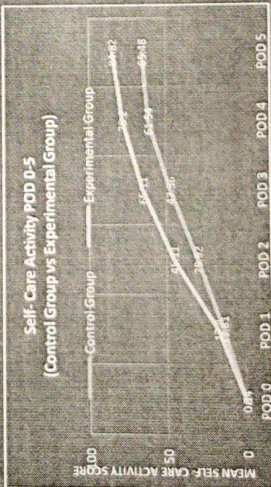
Introduction

Preoperative period may refer to preoperative, intraoperative, and postoperative phases of surgery but it is preferably used for the pre and post-operative phases only, meaning, "around" the time of the surgery. It is the collaborative effort of the health team that is responsible for good post-operative outcomes.

Purpose

1. To assess the effectiveness of Nurse Navigation Programme (NNP) for patients undergoing open abdominal surgery using Non-Equivalent Control Groups Design
2. To develop and test a Nursing Care Protocol for nurses taking care of patients undergoing open abdominal surgery

Results



Results

The analyzed data revealed that the mean patient satisfaction score of patients who underwent open abdominal surgery was higher (60.90) among subjects of experimental group as compared to subjects of control group (49.63). The obtained mean difference of patient satisfaction scores between the two groups i.e. 21.27 was found to be statistically significant as evident from the 't' value of 18.51 for degree of freedom (268) at p<0.01 and 0.05 level of significance. Hence, the null hypothesis was rejected and research hypothesis was accepted indicating that the NNP was effective.

Methods

Nurse Navigation Programme (NNP) is a structured educational programme developed and administered by the nurse researcher herself consisting of structured information booklet and video-assisted instruction (both in English and Hindi languages) to aid in preoperative counselling and containing information about open abdominal surgery to empower patient for self-care. Nursing Care Protocol is a set of instructional guidelines regarding peri-operative nursing care developed by the researcher for the nursing personnel from available literature material and the vast clinical experience of the researcher in this field.

Based on the objectives and conceptual framework of the study, tools were developed for collecting data from patients about socio-demographic profile and the outcome parameters which included pain, exercise, self-care activities, comfort, coping with surgical stress (pre and post-operative), patient satisfaction and post-operative events, Structured Opinionnaires for Acceptability and Utility of Nursing Care Protocol were also prepared.

1. Standardized tools used were Numeric Pain Rating Scale and Barthel Index for self-care activity
2. Self-developed tools were Exercise Checklist, Comfort Checklist, Pre-Operative & Post-Operative Surgical Stress Coping Scales, Patient Satisfaction Questionnaire, Post-Operative Event Identification Checklist (for patients), 10-item structured Opinionnaire each towards Acceptability and Utility of Nursing Care Protocol (for Nursing personnel)

Participants

Final Study was conducted in St. Stephen's Hospital and GB Pant Hospital of India on 270 patients using purposive sampling technique. The subjects were equally divided into Control group and Experimental group comprising of 135 subjects in each group. Nurse navigation programme was administered to Experimental group subjects and routine instructions were given to Control group subjects regarding peri-operative care. The Nursing Care Protocol developed by the researcher was administered and tested for its acceptability and utility among 62 nursing personnel working in the surgical units and involved in the care of surgical patients using total enumerative sampling technique.

Discussion and Conclusions

NNP was found to be effective for experimental group patients undergoing open abdominal surgery in terms of surgical outcomes as evident from the favourable scores of outcome parameters as compared to control group patients. The developed Nursing Care Protocol was tested and found to be highly acceptable and highly useful among the nursing personnel for the nursing care of patients undergoing open abdominal surgery.

Recommendations

1. A similar study can be replicated on larger samples from more hospitals globally as a pilot project
2. Nurse navigation programme may be developed in other areas too such as MCH, mental health and community health settings and utilized for a variety of patient conditions

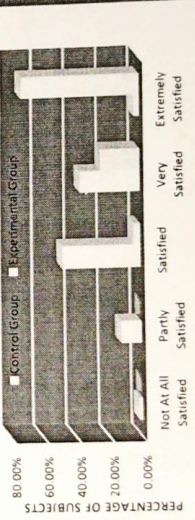

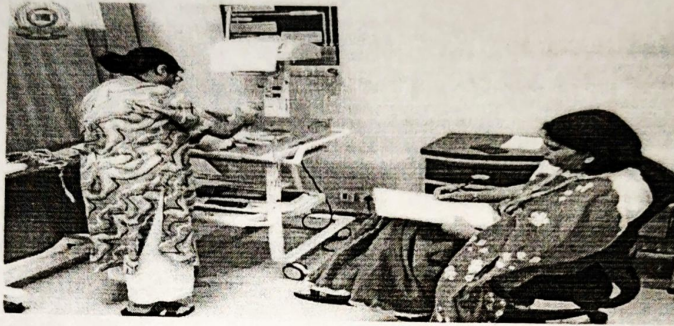
Day 2: The second day included the practical session of the midwifery procedures like abdominal palpation, PV examination, NVD, AMTSL and NRP of special task trainers.


Day 3: On the third day the procedures like breastfeeding, insertion of IUCD were performed. Practice teachings were done by the delegates using experiential learning.

"First, do no harm" is the most fundamental principle of any health care service. No one should be harmed in health care; however, there is compelling evidence of a huge burden of avoidable patient harm globally across the developed and developing health care systems. This has major human, moral, ethical and financial implications. Patient safety is defined as "the absence of preventable harm to a patient and reduction of risk of unnecessary harm associated with health care to an acceptable minimum." Within the broader health system context, it is "a framework of organized activities that creates cultures, processes, procedures, behaviours, technologies and environments in health care that consistently and sustainably lower risks, reduce the occurrence of avoidable harm, make error less likely and reduce impact of harm when it does occur."

St. Stephen's Hospital College of Nursing organized a two days 2nd National conference on 28th and 29th September 2023 with the theme: "**Patient Safety: No Space for Human Err**". The organizing chairperson for the Conference was Prof. Dr. Feba Geevarghese, Principal, St. Stephen's Hospital College of Nursing. The Chief Guest of the Conference was Dr. Sudhir C. Joseph, Director, St. Stephen's Hospital. REPORT ON

TRAINING COURSE ON HEALTH CARE OF ELDERLY FOR HOLISTIC HEALTH AND WELL BEING.

Population aging is a global phenomenon and India is not an exception. The older population aged 70 years and above are expected to rise from 2.9% to 7.6% during 2001- 2051. According to the latest WHO data published in 2020 life expectancy in India is Male-69.5 and female-72.2 and total life expectancy is 70.8 which gives India a World Life expectancy ranking of 117.

National Institute of Health and Family Welfare (NIHFW) organized a 5-day Training Course from 6th November to 10th November 2023 and each day consisted of 4 sessions conducted by External Experts of various departments. There was a total of 36 participants who attended the training course.

The specific objectives of the training course were:

1. To familiarize the issues and challenges related to ageing and health
2. To discuss salient features of holistic care, health and well-being of elderly people as visualized in the National Policy for Older Persons, National Policy for senior citizens and National Program for the Health Care of Elderly.
3. To list out potential roles and responsibilities of health care providers to be executed at individual, social and Institutional levels.
4. To discuss the roles of states in participation with non-state stakeholders to address the social security, health care and overall wellbeing of elderly people.
5. To describe the importance of palliative and institutional care and management of the health and nutritional needs of the elderly.



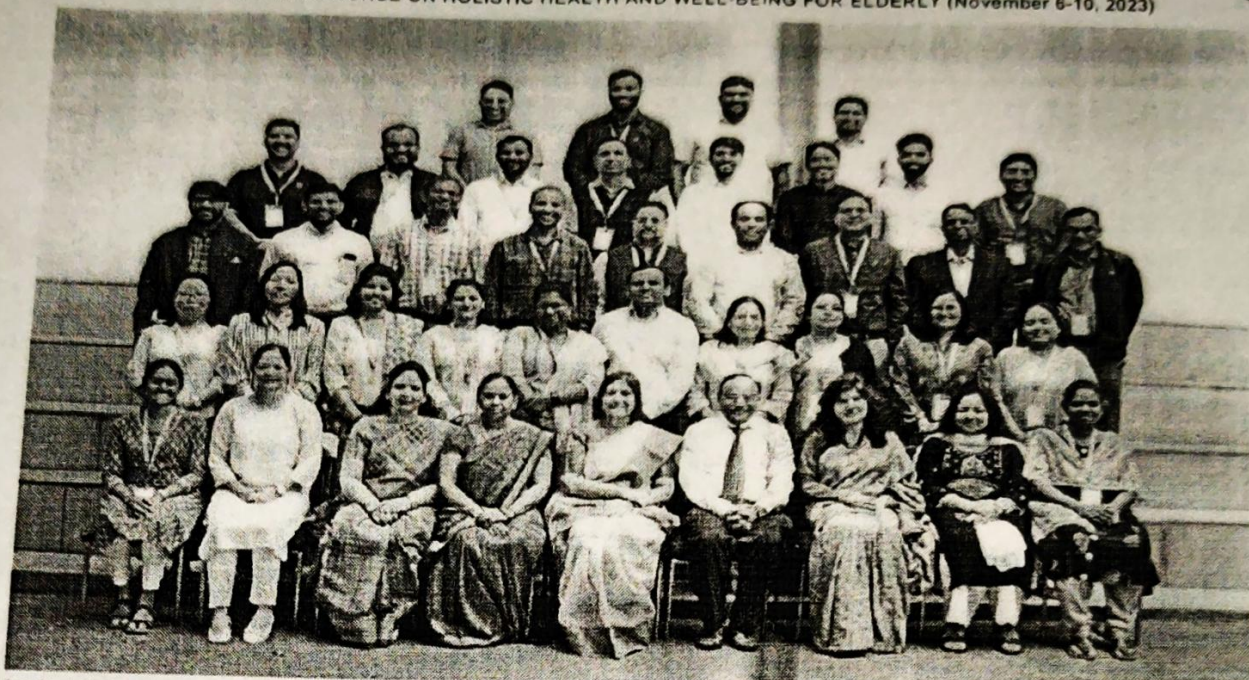
