POSTER COMPETITIONON 'WORLD NO TOBACCO DAY 2023'


















SLOGAN COMPETITION ON THE OCCASION OF 'INDIAN ORGAN DONATION DAY'



FACULTY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME



The International Council of Nurses (ICN) Congress 2023 was held in person from 1-5 July 2023 at the Palais des Congrès in Montreal, Canada, in partnership with the Canadian Nurses Association (CNA). The theme of Congress 2023 was "Nurses Together: A Force for Global Health".130 National Nurses' Associations (NNAs) of their respective countries with around 5000 Nurse delegates attended the Conference. There were main sessions, plenary sessions, concurrent sessions, symposia, master classes and policy café' during the Conference.

Our Principal Prof. Dr. Feba Geevarghese attended the ICN Congress as her paper was accepted for pres-

entation in the ICN Congress. She was sponsored from St. Stephen's Hospital and had also been sanctioned travel grant from Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR). She was one among 3 persons from India selected to present paper during this International Conference and it is a matter of great pride and honour for our Institution for her achievement at an international platform. Her Topic of Poster presentation was 'A study was conducted to assess the effectiveness of Nurse Navigation Programme for patients undergoing open abdominal surgery in tertiary care hospitals of Delhi with a view to develop a Nursing Care Protocol'. This was her PhD area of research and Nurse Navigation Programme is a novel initiative in Nursing. Her Guide and Co- Guide were Prof.



Dr. Manju Chhugani, Dean School of Nursing and Allied Health Sciences, Jamia Hamdard University and Prof. Dr. Sudhir C. Joseph, Director, St. Stephen's Hospital. Her work was published as Poster and displayed in the E- Poster Viewing stations in the Congress venue and Virtual Platform Gallery in the ICN Website.

The 'Onsite Skill Standardization and Simulation Training' for capacity building of Midwifery faculty in India was conducted at National Reference Simulation Centre, SGT University Gurugram, organized by Indian Nursing Council in collaboration with UNPFA from 21.08.2023 to 25.08. 2023.

Prof. Sheeba Joseph, Vice Principal of our College was sponsored from the college to attend the training. 25 participants from various states participated in the training.
